#### This Little Light of Mine

I thought of this song recently when I arrived at church to see only a handful of cars in the front parking lot. Once inside, there were far more people there to worship than I would have expected. Why? Because so many of us park in the back parking lot which is not visible to those driving around our local roads. We're "hiding our light under a bushel". I wondered if newcomers might have second thoughts about attending if they only saw a few cars on Sunday morning out front. If

you are able bodied enough for the walk from the front parking lot to our front doors, please give some thought about **parking where others can see you for worship and special community events. Let's show our neighbors that we're here!** "All around the neighborhood, I'm going to let it shine!" More about this beloved song. There are differing accounts of who wrote "This Little Light of Mine", but is has been recorded numerous times throughout the 20th and 21st centuries. In addition to its key place in American folk and gospel music, the song holds significance as an anthem of the civil rights movement. Activists sang "freedom song" versions of it and passed them along to others during the 1950's and 1960's to reference their struggles. And the song shines on today as an American anthem that sparks a powerful feeling, making us feel a little less alone and a little more free.

#### Can you help us with Coffee Hour?

Every week, we have a time to gather after our church services for fellowship, our "Coffee Hour". It is a wonderful way to welcome new visitors, to catch up with your friends or make new friends, and to talk with our pastor. We are always looking for people to help us host this time together. Each month, a different church committee is tasked with the responsibility to ensure we have coverage. The committee members can serve, or they can find others to serve. We could use more people helping with this welcoming ministry. If being behind the table feels too intimidating to you, team up with a more extroverted person. There are plenty of smiles and conversation to be shared. Volunteering in this way will leave you with a wonderful feeling from having let God's spirit shine through you as you serve others. Here are some answers to questions that are frequently asked by those who are new to hosting Coffee Hour:

#### If I hosted, what do I need to purchase/bring?

Let's start with what you don't need to bring! Coffee, tea, and creamers are all provided each week, so hosts just need to prepare it. Plates and napkins and cups are stocked in advance. Hosts bring snacks and juice of their own choosing to share for Coffee Hour.

#### How many snacks do I need to bring?

Sometimes it looks like it there is so much and that could be expensive for me. There is no expected amount to bring, and yet we always seem to have enough. Often times what we bring is supplemented refreshments leftover from events held earlier in the week, or stored in the freezer from the prior week. Many of us like to combine households when we volunteer to share the expense and the responsibilities with others.

#### Do I need to bake anything or can I bring store made items?

It is your choice as to what to bring and whether to make it yourself or purchase it. All options are appreciated!

#### Would I have to cover both services?

During the months when we have two services, some volunteers cover both services, and some elect to cover just one and find someone else to cover the other.

#### How would I learn how to do this, making the coffee for example?

The best way to learn is to volunteer to serve with someone else who has done this before so you can learn by doing. Additionally, there are instructions for making the coffee on the inside of the cabinet door. And, there are always others around who would be happy to answer questions if something comes up unexpectantly.

#### How do I sign up?

This is a great time to get started because in May and June, we will have one service only and therefore only one Coffee Hour each Sunday.

Finance is responsible for May, and Endowment and Memorials are responsible for June. In the summer months, we have Punch on the Patio after the one service.
